- or just a blog

- WordPress 2 versions:
- 1.) WordPress.com
- 2.) WordPress.org

The Difference Between WordPress.com & WordPress.org

- 1.) WordPress.com
 - Hosted and web-based
 - No hassles with installation, upgrades, backups, or security
 - Less technical
 - Less flexibility & control over design & features.

The Difference Between WordPress.com & WordPress.org

- 2.) WordPress.org
 - Self-hosted software
 - Needs installation & custom set up
 - Downloaded from WordPress.org

The Difference Between WordPress.com & WordPress.org

- 2.) WordPress.org
 - Ideal for tech-savvy people
 - complete control over set up
 - custom themes & plugins
 - e-commerce functionality
 - code modification

Understanding Web Hosting

- If you plan to use WordPress.ORG
 - select a compatible web host
 - not all with host WordPress script

Understanding Web Hosting

- If you plan to use WordPress.COM
 - don't need to select a web host
 - web hosting is included


- A domain name the URL/web address

- Step 1
- What do I want to achieve with this website?
- Do I want to sell products or services, share my expertise with the world, or spread the word about a special cause?
- What content or structure will help me achieve my goals?
- Who is my target audience?
- What keywords are most relevant to the focus of my website?

- Step 2
- Select a WordPress Version
- (hosted WordPress.com or self-hosted WordPress.org)

Determine Your Goals


- Step 3
- Figure out your domain name
- The right domain name can make a big difference in how your website is perceived and the audience it attracts.

- Step 4
- Figure out website content and structure.
- At a minimum map out your pages, subpages, blog categories, menu structure, & sidebar structure.

Determine Your Goals

- Step 5
- Select a starting theme.
- visualize what your site would look like when complete
- Preview available themes for WordPress.com @ http://theme.wordpr ess.com
- Preview themes for self-hosted WordPress
 @ http://wordpress.org/extend/themes

- Step 6
- Get started on your new website!
- Don't worry too much about creating the "perfect" plan.
- WordPress is flexible, and you can change pages, menu structure, categories, plugins, and themes as you go along.





Posts

- Display on the home page
- In chronological order, newest post first
- Or on a dedicated blog page

Pages

- Create static content that's not part of your Blog or Feed.
- Examples: About Our Business, Meet the Team, Products, Services, Contact Us and Client Portal.
- If your site is mostly a blog, you might need only 2 pages.
- Examples: About this Blog and Contact Me
