- A website any site on the Web
- A blog is a type of website
  - or section of a website

### WordPress. WHAT IT IS?

- a website
- a website with a blog component
- or just a blog

WordPress 2 versions:

- 1.) WordPress.com
- 2.) WordPress.org

#### 1.) WordPress.com

- Hosted and web-based
- No hassles with installation, upgrades, backups, or security
- Less technical
- Less flexibility & control over design & features.

- 2.) WordPress.org
  - Self-hosted software
  - Needs installation & custom set up
  - Downloaded from WordPress.org

#### 2.) WordPress.org

- Ideal for tech-savvy people
- complete control over set up
- custom themes & plugins
- e-commerce functionality
- code modification

- If you plan to use WordPress.ORG
  - select a compatible web host
  - not all will host WordPress script

- If you plan to use WordPress.COM
  - don't need to select a web host
  - web hosting is included



## Understanding Domain Names

- WordPress.com offers 2 options:
  - 1. free, default address wronghands1.wordpress.com
  - 2. unique domain name you have to purchase

- Step 1
- What do I want to achieve with this website?
- Do I want to sell products or services, share my expertise with the world, or spread the word about a special cause?
- What content or structure will help me achieve my goals?
- Who is my target audience?
- What keywords are most relevant to the focus of my website?

- Step 2
- Select a WordPress Version (hosted on WordPress.com or self-hosted WordPress.org)


- Step 3
- Figure out your domain name
- The right domain name can make a big difference in how your website is perceived and the audience it attracts.

- Step 4
- Figure out website content and structure.
- At a minimum map out your pages, subpages, blog categories, menu structure, & sidebar structure.

- Step 5
- Select a starting theme.
- visualize what your site would look like when complete
- Preview available themes for WordPress.com on "theme.wordpress.com"
- Preview themes for self-hosted WordPress on "wordpress.org/extend/themes"

- Step 6
- Get started on your new website (or blog)!
- Don't worry too much about creating the "perfect" plan.
- WordPress is quite flexible, and you can change everything (including pages, menu structure, categories, plugins, and themes) as you go along.

### POSTS VS. PAGES



### Posts

- Display on the home page
- In chronological order, newest post first
- Or on a dedicated blog page

### Pages

- Create static content that's not part of your Blog or Feed.
- Examples: About Our Business, Meet the Team, Products, Services, Contact Us and Client Portal.
- If your site is mostly a blog, you might need only 2 pages.
- Examples: About this Blog and Contact Me
