# Chicago.Craigslist.org

Good for finding jobs at smaller companies and piecemeal work. Inexpensive for employers to post listings. Consider posting a listing yourself under "Services". Be aware of scams, look at "Avoid scams & Fraud"section.

#### Associations & Organizations

Do a google search for relevant associations & organizations, they often provide job postings and job search help



#### Targeting Companies

Instead of being reactive by responding to postings, be proactive by targeting companies.

Many postings are not made public, they are filled from recommendations. Try to become one of the recommended candidates

Some employers will create a position to keep a good prospect

#### Steps:

- Find companies you want to work for
- Network and find information about employment there
- Contact potential decision makers and sell your skills



# Targeting Companies

#### ReferenceUSA



- A subscription business directory available via Skokie Public Library website skokielibrary.info/resources/research/
- Has the ability to create lists of businesses & organizations limited by criteria such as:
  - Size
  - Type of business
  - Location
- Can be used to create target lists of potential employers (for instance, all large electronic manufacturers in the North Chicago area)

# MeetUp.com - What is It?



- Meetup allows members to find and join groups unified by a common interest, such as politics, books, games, movies, health, pets, careers or hobbies.
- Users enter their postal code or their city and the topic they want to meet about
- Topic listings are also available for users who only enter a location

#### Social Media – How Can It Help

- Provides a resource to network with friends, colleagues, industry leaders & connectors; to link far beyond what you can achieve via face-to-face networking
- Allows you to influence how online content about you appears to a potential employer
- Helps in developing and promoting your personal brand
