

What is the EPA?

The mission of the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is to protect human health and the environment. The two main tasks of the EPA are to ensure that federal laws protecting human health and the environment are enforced fairly and effectively and to lead national efforts to reduce environmental risk.1

Conversation Questions

- 1. What is our responsibility as a country, as a community, and as individuals to protect the environment?
- 2. To what extent should a new administration be able to quickly change existing environmental regulations enacted by previous administrations?
