


Texts


- 160 character phone message between two or more people
- Use when you have a quick message to share like "I'm here"
- When it's hard to hear or you can't talk on the phone

Where is the Texting app?











If you receive text messages, there may be a number next the icon that indicated the number of unread messages



Opening the message app








Standard Texting Screen

- Who the text is going to (can be multiple people)
- Select recipient from contacts
- 3. Enter the body of the message
- 4. Include an attachment
- Autocorrect or suggested words
- 6. Your keyboard
- 7. Change to get symbols and punctuation



Check your app settings




- Change your font, font size, color
