# Key Facts<sup>1</sup>

- The National Park Service covers more than 84 million acres and is composed of 417 sites, including historical parks or sites, national monuments, national parks, battlefields, recreation areas, seashores, parkways, lakeshores, and reserves.
- The National Park Service employs more than 22,000 permanent, temporary, and seasonal workers.
- The National Park Service operates as a bureau within the Department of the Interior, and was formally established by President Woodrow Wilson on August 25, 1916.

- 1. What lands were designated and set aside for the creation of national parks?
- 2. What controversies might have surrounded the designation of public lands adjacent to land currently or previously held by indigenous groups?
- 3. What is the mission of the National Park Service, and how do we see that play out?


