birds? How long do you go and how many species would you say you see in Do you use binoculars? A scope? A zoom camera? How do you find the one trip? Do you go certain times of the day?


Then, how do you keep track of what birds you saw? Do you keep the ebird app open and just track them as you see them? Do you write them down and report later? Just remember then?
