#### **PEBBLEGO**



Opposing Viewpoints provides information about current events, telling both sides of a story.




# RENOVITION2020

### PHASE ONE: The Second Floor

Before we temporarily closed the building in March, staff got to witness a few highlights:

- All of the second-floor windows were replaced using a machine with giant suction cups to hold them up while the crew got them into just the right place.
- Walls went up to enclose the new study rooms and other spaces.
- A new workroom for accepting, sorting, and handling returned items is being built on the first floor, along with space for the bookmobile staff and other offices.















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
