About the Library




Skokie Public Library is a place where I can go to read, play, learn, and have fun.

Librarian

When I need help, I ask a librarian.





The librarian at the desk can help me find the books and movies I like. If I get lost the librarian will help me find my grown-up.

Computer Games






There are some computers that I can use on my own. I'm allowed to use them for 20-30 minutes. When my time is up, I let the next person take a turn.

Programs








On special days I can go to a program. The program will be in a room or outside with many people. I sit down to watch the show. I follow directions if there is a teacher.

How I Check Out

Checking Out with a Clerk

I need to check out what I want to borrow before I leave the Library. These are the steps I follow:

- 1. I go to the Circulation Desk. I may need to wait in line for someone to help me.
- 2. I give the clerk my Library card and the things I'm checking out.
- 3. I wait for the clerk to scan my books and other items.
- 4. I take my Library card and receipt from the clerk. The receipt tells me when to bring my items back to the Library.



How I Check Out

Checking Out by Myself

If I want to, I can check out my things by myself. These are the steps that I follow:

- 1. I hold my Library card barcode under the red light.
- 2. I place my items on the machine one at a time.
- 3. I wait for the ding sound before putting the next item on the machine.
- 4. If I have a movie or video game, I unlock it myself.
- 5. When I've checked out everything, I press "print receipt."



Returning Things to the Library

When I am finished with what I borrow I return everything to the Library.



I put books in the Youth slot one at a time. I put music, movies, and games in the audio-visual slot one at a time.

Returning Things to the Library



I can also return items in the automatic check in machine. I wait for the green light and place them on the belt one at a time. When they are all gone, I can push the button and get a receipt to show I returned everything on time.
